Topic: Safe Driving within the Airport Precinct

Background

AAL has recently observed an increase in vehicles travelling above posted speed limits, not consistently following road rules and manoeuvring within designated line markings. These behaviours cause unnecessary additional risk within the airport precinct. The airport is a busy shared environment used by customers, workers, contractors, visitors, pedestrians, cyclists, buses, taxis, rideshare vehicles, and other road users.

The purpose of this safety alert is to remind all drivers to slow down, follow the road rules, and drive with courtesy and care whenever travelling within the airport precinct.

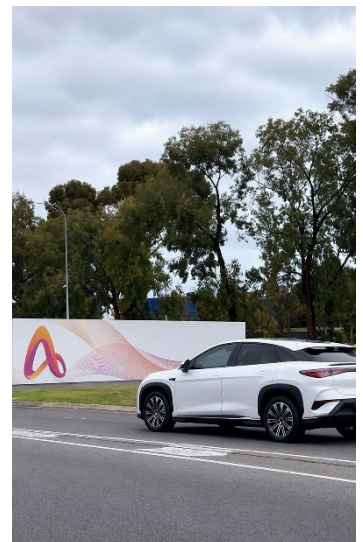
Action Required

Everyone who drives within the airport precinct has a role in keeping our roads, car parks, loading areas, and shared spaces safe. Please do not allow familiarity with the precinct, time pressures, or routine travel to reduce your attention to safe driving. Small choices, such as keeping to the speed limit and giving way appropriately, make a meaningful difference to the safety of the whole airport community.

The key safe driving actions are:

- Always drive to the posted speed limit and slow down further where conditions require it, including in car parks, shared zones, loading areas, and areas with pedestrian activity.
- Observe all road rules, signs, traffic controls, give way requirements, and line marking within the airport precinct.
- Be courteous and patient with all road users, including pedestrians, buses, taxis, rideshare drivers, delivery vehicles, contractors, and other workers.
- Report unsafe driving behaviours, damaged signs, faded line marking, or road hazards to the Adelaide Airport Coordination Centre on 8154 9444.

Thank you to all staff, contractors, tenants, and airport community members who drive safely and help maintain a respectful road environment across the precinct. AAL appreciates your ongoing commitment to safety. By doing the right thing, we can help ensure everyone gets where they need to go safely.
